PUBLIC INFORMATION TEXT REGARDING MAJOR INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT PREVENTION ACTIVITIES

1. PURPOSE

This document has been prepared to inform the relevant parties (public/public units/visitors, etc.) about the measures and measures implemented by Yakamoz Yağ Sanayi ve Ticaret A.Ş. to prevent possible industrial accidents during its activities.

2. SCOPE

It covers the activities in the processes published in Annex-1 of the Regulation on the Prevention of Major Industrial Accidents and Reducing Their Effects, published on 02.03.2019 and numbered 30702, and where Yakamoz Yağ Sanayi ve Ticaret A.Ş. stores/uses these hazardous substances or includes them in its operations during its activities.

4. INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC ABOUT BKÖP ACTIVITIES

4.1. Name and Full Address of the Establishment:

The trade name of the establishment registered in its activity certificate is Yakamoz Yağ Sanayi ve Ticaret A.Ş. is Ataturk Organized Industrial Zone 10035 Sk. It carries out its activities at No:7/2 Çiğli/İzmir.

4.2. Scope of the Establishment's Regulation:

Yakamoz Yağ Sanayi ve Ticaret A.Ş. has made the necessary declarations using the notification system of the Ministry of Environment, Urbanization and Climate Change in accordance with the requirements specified in Article 7 of the Regulation on the Prevention of Major Industrial Accidents and Reducing Their Effects and has been determined as a lower-level organization. The organization is subject to this regulation due to its scope and has prepared and recorded the "Major Accident Prevention Policy Document" required to be prepared in Article-10.

4.3. Simple Summary Information About the Activity of the Establishment:

Establishment: Vegetable oil production is currently carried out on 12 plots, 2180 block, 1 and 4 parcels in İzmir Province, Çiğli District, Atatürk Organized Industrial Zone. The process approach is summarized below.

The basic raw material of vegetable oil production is oilseeds. After the oilseeds are separated from their shells following the crushing stage, they are subjected to various processes and are divided into two as crude oil and meal. While meals are used as animal feed, crude oil is refined and turned into table vegetable oil. Crude oil is also used in the production of biodiesel and in the production of soap and paint.

4.4. Basic Hazard Statements of Hazardous Substances That May Cause Major Accidents:

Name of Dangerous Substance	Hazard Code and Description
N-Hexane	H225: Highly flammable liquid and vapour. H304: Fatal if swallowed and enters the respiratory tract. H315: Causes skin irritation. H336: May cause drowsiness or dizziness. H361fd: Suspected of damaging fertility. Suspected of causing harm to the unborn child. H373: May cause damage to organs (nervous system) through prolonged or repeated exposure if inhaled. H411: Toxic to aquatic life with long lasting effects.
Diesel	H226: Flammable liquid and vapour. H304: Fatal if swallowed and enters the respiratory tract. H315: Causes skin irritation. H332: Harmful if inhaled. H351: Suspected of causing cancer. H373: May cause damage to organs through prolonged or repeated exposure. H411: Toxic to aquatic life with long lasting effects. EUH066: Repeated exposure may cause skin dryness or cracking.

4.5. Information on What to Do in Case of a Major Accident in the Establishment:

4.5.1. Steps to be Implemented within the Establishment:

In case of a major industrial accident caused by the hazardous substances mentioned above, emergency management is initiated in line with the "İSG-PLN-001-Emergency Action Plan" directives prepared and documented in the factory and the requirements specified in the plan are put into practice.

- There are emergency response teams within the organization, consisting of appropriately equipped and trained individuals. These units go to the scene and ensure the safety of the scene of accident without risking themselves.
- While trying to ensure scene of accident safety, the Organized Industrial Zone Directorate Fire Department, İzmir Metropolitan/Çiğli Municipality fire departments, emergency services and law

enforcement forces (Ambulance, Police, gendarmerie, etc.) were called to respond to the incident. notification is made. The following information will be shared upon request..

- o Formation and course of development of the accident.
- o Name and contact information of the person responsible for managing the emergency.
- The emergency response team within the organization comes under the auspices of emergency support services when the Fire Brigade, emergency services and law enforcement officers arrive at the scene, and all controls are now provided by these services. The incident is brought under control by applying the necessary intervention methods.
- Evaluation meetings are held and recorded regarding the reasons for the incident and the precautions to be taken to prevent it from recurring.

4.5.2. What Those Around the Establishment Should Do During the Incident:

<p>How Do I Get Informed About a Major Industrial Accident in the Establishment?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • With television channels and radio frequencies • Sirens of emergency support teams (Fire Department, Ambulance, Police, Gendarmerie, Non-Governmental Organizations, etc.) • Announcements (Announcement, etc.)
<p>How Do I Know If There Is A Dangerous Situation/Industrial Accident?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visual impressions at the scene (Fire, smoke, etc.) • Hearing a loud explosion sound • Feeling a different smell than the usual natural state • Burning sensation/irritation in the eyes and throat • Feeling unexpected situations such as nausea
<p>What Should I Do If I Realize There Has Been A Major Accident?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay away from the accident scene and do not approach the scene. • If you are at home, close your doors, including windows and all door sills. If you are in an environment with air conditioning (home, car, workplace, etc.), turn off the air conditioning/ventilation. • If you see that there are people around you who need special support, such as the elderly/child, direct them to a safe area. If possible, provide directions to their homes. • Do not occupy the phone numbers of emergency support teams (Fire Department, Ambulance, Police, Gendarmerie, etc.) unnecessarily. • Do not move unless you are asked to leave your location by emergency support teams. • If you are asked to leave, walk away from the scene, towards higher points. Do not drive. • Avoid open flames (e.g. cigarettes, burning a stove, etc.) due to possible explosion risk.
